

## Oceanian Para Records

### OCEANIA & WORLD RECORDS (World Para Athletics Classifications Only)

For an Oceania/World record to be claimed the following criteria must be met;

1. Internationally classified with WPA (review year after the year in which the record is being broken)
2. Internationally licensed with WPA (listed here - <https://www.paralympic.org/athletics/classified-athletes>)
3. Anti-Doping assigned to the meet
4. Meet sanctioned with WPA (listed here - <https://www.paralympic.org/athletics/events>)
5. They must then have the below documents completed and sent to the AA competitions team, within 72 hours to be sent through to WPA.

### OCEANIA & WORLD RECORDS (IAADS)

To claim an IAADS Oceanian Record, you will need to fill out a claim form from IAADS website.

### AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL RECORDS

There is one universal form to be used for claiming track, field and combined event records and can be used for claiming open and underage Australian records for both able bodied athletes and athletes with a disability.

For underage records, since 1st January 1998, the determination of age groups has been that for an athlete to be recognised as the holder of an underage record, the athlete shall be under the specified age as at 31st December in the year of the performance.

When claiming a record, the following supporting documents are required:

- [Record application form](#)
- Official result
- Photo finish print
- Timekeepers recording sheet showing 3 times, for hand timed records
- Wind readings (if applicable)
- Lap score sheets (if applicable)
- Walk judges report (if applicable)
- Meet Program
- Proof of date of birth

The completed record application form and supporting documents should be uploaded to the [Record Application Portal](#) within 28 days. Please Note Record Applications will not be accepted by any means other than the Record Application Portal. It is recommended that persons claiming records keep a copy of all documentation uploaded to the Athletics Australia Record Portal.
